Our beautiful scenic venue! It's located just outside the city in the (very large) Patapsco State Park. If you're driving or ride sharing, make sure to search for the "Pickall Area" or use the address above to make sure you find the right entrance.

Unfortunately, there are no public transit routes to the park itself, so we have rented a passenger van that will be leaving from Hannah's house at 3:30PM. Please let us know if you plan to ride in the van so we can keep track of capacity! Prioritizing out of towners for the van, but there may be room for others, stay tuned for ridesharing coordination.

We're located in Harwood, right next to Charles Village and a few blocks away from the main Johns Hopkins campus. It's an extremely walkable neighborhood with lots of bus routes. The Circulator is free, and others cost \$2.

Transit App

The best way to get transit information in Baltimore is through the Transit app. It has real-time vehicle tracking, up to date timetables, and pretty good route finding. Basically all the information we've added below can be found in the Transit app - just open it up, put in your destination, and it'll show you all the ways to get there. It covers every form of transit in the city, including buses, light rail, commuter rail, Amtrak, and safe(r) bike routes.

CharmPass App

Charmpass is the unified app for all transit fares except Amtrak. It's pretty simple to use; just make sure you select MARC passes for the commuter rail (to and from the airport and DC) and BaltimoreLink passes for everything else (buses, light rail, and metro)

From BWI Airport

Via Light Rail

The light rail is the easiest way to get from BWI into the city. In about 40 minutes, it'll take you from the airport terminal to Mt Vernon, and a few more minutes will get you to Hampden. If you're staying in Mt Vernon or Hampden, it's definitely worth checking to see if there's a stop close by. If you're coming straight to our neighborhood, you can get off at the Mt Royal/MICA station, walk two blocks to Penn Station, and catch one of the frequent buses going north to Charles Village/Harwood. The BWI Light Rail station is located in the terminal at the northern end, just past Concourse E.

Trains run every 30 minutes from 5am-9pm on Sundays and 5am-12:40am all other days - the Transit app is the best way to track it in real-time.

Light Rail passes are \$2 one-way and can be purchased on the CharmPass app (select BaltimoreLink)

Via Amtrak/MARC commuter rail

Amtrak and MARC trains will take you from BWI to Penn Station, which is a bit closer to our neighborhood and serviced by multiple north/south bus routes that will take you straight here. The BWI Amtrak/MARC station (7 Amtrak Way, BWI Airport, MD 21240) is located just outside the airport and there's a shuttle bus that runs every 10-15 minutes from the main terminal to the station. These trains run faster than the light rail, so the total travel time (including the shuttle) is about the same (35 minutes to Penn Station). Check the next section ("From Baltimore Penn Station" for more directions.

Trains run at least once per hour on weekdays and every two hours on weekends - the Transit app is the best way to track it in real-time.

MARC passes are \$6 one-way and can be purchased on the CharmPass app (select MARC train)

If the MARC train timing doesn't work out, the Amtrak trains take the same routes and are a bit faster - they're just more expensive (especially last minute).

From Baltimore Penn Station

Congratulations! You made it to Baltimore City. Depending on where you're staying, there's probably an easy bus route to take you there - we've described some major routes below, but the Transit App is your best bet for planning routes and tracking buses.

To Hannah's house, Charles Village, Remington and Harwood

Penn Station is right at the center of the North/South trunk of the Baltimore bus system, so there are tons of routes that will take you 1.6 miles north to our neighborhood: Silver, 95, 51, and 103 buses (\$2) and the Purple Circulator (free) pick up on Charles Street and will all get you within a few blocks. Those buses split off at various points to go to other neighborhoods, so check the Transit app to see the best specific routes.

To Midtown, Mt Vernon, and Downtown

Purple, Silver, and Green buses go south from Penn Station on St Paul street.

East/West/Elsewhere

The bus system is fairly dense in the center of the city and more sparse as you go into East and West Baltimore. It's still a great way to get around, but make sure to check the Transit app ahead of time to make sure.
